PCLT selected to present at 2013 National Mentoring Summit

We are pleased to announce that PCLT has been selected to present two (2) workshops at the third annual National Mentoring Summit to be held January 24-25, 2013 at the Renaissance Mayflower Hotel, Washington, DC.

Dr. Sherry Barr, PCLT's Vice President, will co-present the workshop, *Achievement Mentoring Program Reduces School Discipline Referrals and Improves Grades*, with Dr. Brenna Bry, Professor, Chair of the Clinical Psychology Department, and Director of Clinical Training at Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey's Graduate School of Applied and Professional Psychology. Dr. Bry is the creator of the Achievement Mentoring Program, which has been described as a Model Program by the National Dropout Prevention Center; noted as a Blueprints Promising Program by the Center for the Study and Prevention of Violence; and evaluated as positive by the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention.

A second workshop entitled, *Peer Group Connection: Evidence-Based Group Mentoring that Helps Transform Schools into Safer and More Supportive, Engaging, and Inspiring Environments*, will be co-presented by Dr. Barr and PCLT's Senior Director of Development, Dr. Margo Ross. This is the second consecutive year that Drs. Barr and Ross have been invited to present a workshop on PGC at the Summit.

The 2013 Summit theme will be: *Mentoring Works: Inspire. Achieve. Advocate*. MENTOR, the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS), the Harvard School of Public Health, the U.S. Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) and United Way Worldwide will bring together leading youth-serving organizations, along with government, civic, research and corporate leaders to evaluate best program models, examine new research, project future developments in the field and fundamentally ensure that more youth receive quality mentoring.
